Starting this weekend, Bengaluru will have witness to an art show that aims to bring emotions born of two wheels into the realm of artistic expression, on canvas and beyond. The Moto Art Show, the brainchild of many artist Mukta Prakash and automobile designer Nikhil Agarwal, will present the works of 12 multi-disciplinary motorcycle artists from across the country in a month-long show titled 'Art of the Rider'.

Prakash, a computer engineer by profession, who was previously based in San Francisco, now resides in Bengaluru, while Agarwal, who is currently based in Japan, is an art lover who likes to create motorcycle memorabilia under the tag 'Hatsuda Works'. "I am an artist and a hobbyist, so this was a way for me to combine both my passions," says Prakash, on her position for starting this initiative. "Moto art shows are common in the US, but usually as a small part of motorcycle, expos, and when there are motorcycle events, the focus tends to be on them than the art. I wanted the art to get a good promotion, which is why we are doing this in an art gallery." At the exhibition, Prakash will show off her acrylic works while Agarwal's watercolor paintings will be on display.

Other artistic talents include those of Hyderabad-based Divina and Sand Laksh, better known as 'Sunderkid' and known on Instagram for their artwork and sketches respectively. Nikhil Agarwal's signature artwork 'The Rider' is a 3D-printed model of a motorcycle, which will be bringing with them watercolor, watercolor-based, and acrylic.
